Lee Sherwood, 81, of Alliance, died peacefully at his home on Friday, March 28, 2003. Born in Bismarck, North Dakota, on October 14, 1921, he had attended North Dakota State University and had lived in the Alliance area for the last 50 years. He was of the Catholic faith.
