Joseph "Joe" Voytko, 68, of Alliance, died on Saturday, June 27, 2009, at 10:15 a.m. at Oakhill Manor in Louisville. He was born on October 8, 1940 in Windber, PA, and lived in Alliance most of his life. A member of Bolton United Methodist Church, he was a 1959 graduate of Alliance High School. Employed at B&W Tubular Plant for many years, he retired as General Foreman. Joe was a member of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles. In his past-time, he enjoyed his motorcycle and was a member of the North American 40 Touring Motorcycle Club and the Gold Wing Motorcycle Club. He loved traveling with his wife Judith, and they have traveled most of the United States. Together, they enjoyed country-western music and line dancing. Joe also enjoyed trout fishing in streams of Pennsylvania and was an avid deer hunter. Woodworking and restoring his 1956 Ford was another passion of his. He is survived by his wife, Judith E.
