Silvester "Silver" Falcone, 78, of Deerfield, died on Thursday, September 25, 2003, at 5:45 p.m. at his home. Born in Alliance on February 16, 1925, he was a resident of the Alliance area all his life and was a graduate of Alliance High School. He was a member of St. Catherine Catholic Church in Lake Milton, and was a longtime former member of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Alliance. A U.S. Army veteran of World War II, Mr. Falcone retired as a machinist from Alliance Machine Co. in 1986 after 40 years of service and was a member of the Dante Alighieri Society.
