Angelo Mangino, 91, of Alliance, passed away on Wednesday, January 01, 2014 at 4:30 p.m. at Altercare of Alliance. Born on February 22, 1922 in Alliance, he lived in Alliance all of his life. He attended Alliance Schools and spent a year in the CCC in Idaho. Angelo was a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church. A veteran of WWII, he served our country in the U. S. Army in the Pacific Theater on the Islands of Palau and Hawaii. He retired from Babcock & Wilcox Tubular Pruducts Division as an ultrasonic inspector in 1980 after 34 years of service.
