Gazella E. Peloso, 93, of Alliance, died on Tuesday, September 2, 2008, at 10:35 a.m. at Canterbury Villa of Alliance. She was born on February 2, 1915 in Empire, Ohio and lived in Alliance most of her life. Mrs. Peloso was a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church and also a member of their Women s Guild. She was also a member of the Roma Society. Gazella had been active with the former Christopher Columbus Auxiliary and of the former Dante Alighieri Auxiliary. She worked as a volunteer at a local soup kitchen and was recognized as a valuable volunteer. As pastimes, she enjoyed bowling, bingo, dancing and cooking.
