Thomas Henry Hatherill, 62, of Alliance, died on October, 4, 2009, at 11:57 a.m. at Mercy Medical Center. Beloved by his family, he will be missed. Born on August 30, 1947 in Chardon, Tom was the third of five sons to be born to John and Helen Ester (Winebar) Hatherill and was named after his great grandfather Henry Hatherill. He was a 1967 graduate of West Branch High School and had worked at Sears for 30 years. He was also an independent contractor as a well-respected finish carpenter. Thomas was very artistic and loved all Ohio sports and even played pool professionally.
