Janet M. Haidet, 94, was called home December 27, 2020. Born October 24, 1926 in Canton to Cyril and Phydalia (Loichot) Kolp, she lived in Alliance and Canton. A graduate of Timken High School, Janet was a charter member of Regina Coeli Catholic Church. She was Past President of Regina Coeli Altar and Rosary Society and had managed Regina Coeli Religious Goods Store. She was also Past President of the Knights of Columbus Auxiliary and drove Meals on Wheels for many years. She enjoyed traveling with her late husband and playing bridge. Janet was a staunch supporter of Mt. Union College.
